**\*Please do not send ALL items to school. Verify the required number of items to place in each pencil case and keep the rest at home. You will be contacted when your child runs out of an item.**

Large Zipper Pencil Case: 1 pencil, 1 eraser, 1 glue stick, scissors, 1 Dry-Erase Marker

2 Box Pencil Cases: 1 for markers, 1 for pencil crayons

It is not necessary that items be new.

**Label EVERYTHING on the list with your child's name (ex: each individual marker, glue stick, etc.)**

- Please also LABEL ALL your child's belongings - EVERYTHING! (sweaters, shoes, lunchbox, **school bag**, etc.) This will save time and money. It will also help reduce confusion and tears at dismissal time. (The name should be written inside objects, when applicable);
- Please make sure your child keeps a full change of clothes (shirt, pants, underwear and socks) in a large Ziploc bag in their school bag at all times;
- For the first week of school, please have your child wear the button that we will provide you with. We suggest having your child practice their phone number and address;
- Your child should only carry ONE BAG to and from school. They must have room for a lunchbox, water bottle, as well as notes and personal belongings in their school bag;
- The children will have Physical Education every week. (We will let you know what days.) Running shoes (no black soles, velcro) are a MUST and they SHOULD REMAIN AT SCHOOL. Your child must arrive dressed for Phys. Ed. in the morning (sweatpants, PETES T-shirt). Their Phys. Ed. shoes (running shoes) will be their inside shoes as well;
- Please remember that we are teaching your child to be independent. When buying shoes or clothes, make sure that they are easy for your child to put on by themselves;
- It is forbidden to bring any toys to school unless advised otherwise by the teachers;
- On the first day of school (one hour appointment), please have your child carry their **school bag and in there, should be their lunch box, water bottle and indoor shoes**. Bring in a separate bag all **school supplies** and all optional items as well. We will show your child where everything goes at this time. They will change their shoes and leave their inside shoes at school. On this day, they will receive a pochette envelope which needs to be emptied every night and returned to school the next day.

**STEP 2:** Insert 10 of the clear plastic sheet protectors in the light blue duo-tang with pockets and 3 holes.

**STEP 3:** Sharpen ALL pencils (24) and ALL coloring pencils (24).

**STEP 4:** Arrange your child's pencil cases and materials as follows.

**STEP 5:** In a large resealable plastic bag, identified with your child's name, please put the rest of the supplies. (Remaining sharpened lead pencils, erasers, glue sticks, extra box of markers, dry erase markers and 2 highlighters.) The extra supplies will be kept in the classroom. Your child will have access to them to replenish when needed. Any left-over supplies will be sent home with your child at the end of the year.

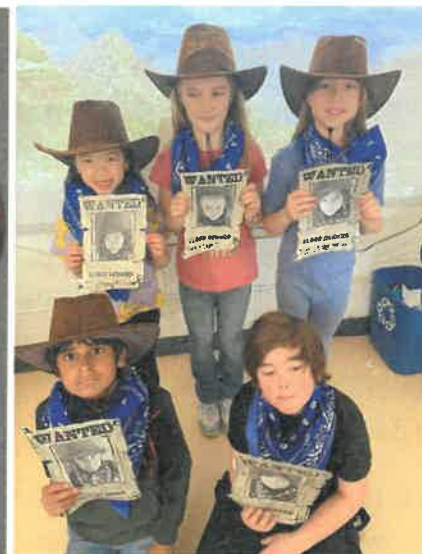
